

# STROKE JUDGE

Stroke and turn judges must be NKSL certified in order to participate as an official on the pool deck.

Stroke judge and Turn judge must understand that they can only disqualify swimmers that are in the three lanes they have been assigned to watch-even if you see a problem in another lane.

Write up the DQ on the slips provided for any infractions you see in your lanes.

The 1<sup>st</sup> heat DQ's must go to the scorer's table immediately. Any exhibition DQ slips should be given to the coaches.

BE sure to fill out the top of the DQ slip so the scorer's table can mark it correctly in the scoring process.

BE sure to tell the coach of any DQ that occurred in the first heat.

# COMPUTER SCOREKEEPER/ASSISTANTS

Computer training will be held at a designated time and place prior to the start of regular season meets. Attendance is strongly encouraged.

The runner will bring you a set of timer slips for the first heat of each race.

By the time you receive the slips, they should be in order by place of finish. Always check to see if this has been done. Also check for Disqualification sheets.

If there is a dispute, the head picker's selections should be attached.

Please understand that some of the times may be reversed as far as quickness, but the delegates have voted to follow the picker selections in case of dispute.

The computer person will notate in meet manager when a judge's decision has occurred.

Any relay can score, but only one per team can receive points.

Scores:	Relays	1 <sup>st</sup> = 7 pts.	2 <sup>nd</sup> = 4pts.	
	Individual	1 <sup>st</sup> = 5 pts.	2 <sup>nd</sup> = 3 pts.	3 <sup>rd</sup> = 1 pts.
